INTRODUCTION

Global Heat Health Information Network

The Global Heat Health Information Network (GHHIN), an UN initiative cosponsored by the World Health Organization (WHO), the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), and the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Agency (NOAA), is a dynamic community of policymakers, scientists, and practitioners working together to mitigate the impact of extreme heat on lives and livelihoods. GHHIN aims to promote evidencedriven interventions, shared-learning, co-production of information, synthesis of priorities, and capacity building through the establishment of regional heat health network hubs around the world. The first hub will be in Southeast Asia, led by the Heat Resilience & Performance Centre (HRPC) at the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, National University of Singapore (NUS).

Southeast Asia Heat Health Forum

For the first time, a dedicated and focused meeting will be held in Southeast Asia, championed by the region to discuss issues and impacts of heat health for the region. Themed *"Toward a heat resilient Southeast Asia: Enhancing livelihoods and wellbeing"*, the forum will bring together over 30 speakers and panellists across the specially curated 4-day agenda, providing opportunities to gain diverse perspectives and engage with leading experts.

The forum will focus on urban heat, occupational heat, and community, cultural & traditional perspectives, seeking to understand heat exposure from a multi-sectoral lens, the impacts on people, health, and livelihoods, and to share management enablers in addition to strategies and solutions to address the challenges.
